**GUIDELINES for COMMUNITY
COLLABORATION & SUPPORT**

Mission

The Mt. Pleasant Community Zone (MPCZ) supports the aspirations of individuals and families in the Mt. Pleasant Community through direct service provision and grants.

MPCZ manages the implementation of the Mt. Pleasant Comprehensive Community Revitalization Plan (**The Plan**) by coordinating, supporting, serving as an information clearinghouse, monitoring, funding, and evaluating the involvement of the organizations, agencies, and institutions committed to carrying out the activities under one or more of the strategic directions: economic development, education, physical environment, **and** family and community empowerment.

MPCZ follows its guiding principles:

- **To build on assets of the community**
- **To expand the capacity of leaders, organizations, and agencies to collaborate; and**
- **To increase the overall impact of everyone's work in the community through coordination, collaboration, and planning.**

MPCZ accomplishes its work through support and collaboration with others who share The Plan's mission and vision. **MPCZ** will evaluate its work and share the results with the Mt. Pleasant Community and beyond.

The Plan consists of four strategic elements:

1. Economic Development
2. Education
3. Physical Environment
4. Family and Community Empowerment

Requests for support are made directly to MPCZ via the Process described in this brochure. Responsive support and collaboration will be made through activities of the 2008 Work Plan and the four strategic areas.

Guidelines for the Mt. Pleasant Community Zone Grant Applications

Grant Application Process

Request for Qualifications (RFQ)

MPCZ will be seeking proposals that relate to one or more of the activities of its 2008 Work Plan and the strategic program areas under the Mt. Pleasant Comprehensive Community Revitalization Strategic Plan.

Goals:

Economic Development – Expand opportunities for Mt. Pleasant residents to increase income and wealth.

Education – Expand the value of educational opportunities and benefits available to Mt. Pleasant residents resulting in increased numbers of graduates with viable options for pursuing life-long learning, career goals, or entrepreneurial opportunities.

Physical Environment & Safety – Maintain and improve the visual appeal of Mt. Pleasant, its functional capacity, sense of safety, and level of community investment.

Community & Family Empowerment – Empower individuals and families in the Mt. Pleasant Community to reach their full potential.

Budget: The MPCZ will allow up to 9% in indirect cost. The indirect cost must be itemized and included in the total grant amount, not in addition to.

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Eligibility

Funding eligibility is limited to community-based organizations or agencies with documented non-profit 501 (c) 3 status or fiscal agency with a 501 (c) 3 status that are located in and/or provides services with in the Mt. Pleasant Community. The applicant organization must have a governing Board of Directors and an Executive Director who is responsible for the day-to-day management of the organization. Applicants must be in good financial standing and must have the appropriate organizational capabilities to receive and administer grant funds.

Limitations

MPCZ does not fund the following:

- Capital Campaign Projects
- Fundraising Events
- Endowment Funds
- Lobbying
- Projects outside of the Mt Pleasant Community that do not directly benefit Mt. Pleasant residents
- Biomedical Research/Biomedical Technology
- Debt Retirement
- Support to Individuals
- Religious Institutions for Religious Purposes

Community Collaboration & Support

MPCZ is committed to working in partnership with all those seeking support & collaboration throughout the application process. This process has been designed to encourage consultation and collaboration between applicant and **MPCZ**. It is designed to minimize the steps necessary to complete a request.

Request For Qualifications (RFQ)

RFQ applications will only be accepted from pre-selected organizations/agencies whose activities correspond and directly impact the activities of MPCZ's 2008 Work Plan and the strategic program areas under the Mt. Pleasant Comprehensive Community Revitalization Strategic Plan.

As a function of the partnership between MPCZ and the organization/agency, MPCZ's staff is available to offer support and guidance throughout the proposal preparation.

Presentation

Purpose

Once received, the proposal is reviewed to determine its support of the objectives of **The Plan** and the mission and vision of MPCZ by the Community Collaboration & Funding Support Committee. If the proposed project is determined to be within one of the four strategic areas of **The Plan and 2008 Work Plan activities**, a presentation will be scheduled.

The purpose of the presentation is threefold:

1. To establish a relationship between MPCZ and the applicant agency/organization.
2. To allow the Committee to gain a thorough understanding of the proposed project and its activities.
3. To allow the organization/agency to become familiar with MPCZ.

Responsibilities

It is at this point the partnership and collaboration between MPCZ and the organization/agency is established. Each has specific responsibilities to the other in this phase of the Application and

Evaluation Process.

It is the responsibility of the organization/agency to:

1. Assemble the principals of the proposed project, key agency personnel, and any other individuals they deem important to the project discussion.
2. Provide a description of the overall mission, vision, and work of the organization/agency.
3. Provide an in-depth description of the proposed project.

It is the responsibility of MPCZ to:

1. Provide the agency with a detailed description of the work of MPCZ.
2. Fully describe the Application and Evaluation Process.

Review Process

RFQs are reviewed on two levels:

1. The MPCZ staff
2. Community Collaboration and Support Funding Committee of the MPCZ's Board will make the final decision.

Decision Making Process

In deciding whether or not to fund a proposal, MPCZ assesses the degree to which the project:

1. Addresses a significant strategic area of **The Plan**, has potential for significant impact on the Mt. Pleasant Community, and is consistent with The Plan's mission and vision, and the activities of the 2008 Work Plan.
2. Has clear goals, measurable outcomes, collaborative partnerships; a budget that reflects the overall proposed project (indirect cost must be itemized and included in the total grant request, not in addition to); and a plan for evaluating progress.
3. Has the capacity and willingness to work with MPCZ Evaluation Team in establishing an evaluation plan and procedure.

Organizations/agencies are kept apprised of the progress of the proposal review process.
